Since the beginning of this century, the Conservatory of music in Udine has been collaborating with national and international Institutions to promote expansion and growth in the musical education of own students and foreign students too of other institutions involved. Cultural exchanges have been organized with the Conservatories of Trieste, Castelfranco Veneto and Venice in Italy, and abroad with several International Institutions: Klagenfurt (Austria), Houston University USA and, in the future, with Florida State University - College of Music USA, Cuba (Havana National Symphony Orchestra, ISA) and China (Beijing and Shenjang University). These collaborations enhanced the standard concert season of the Conservatory and gave us the possibility to organize a great number of master-classes attended by many students either from own Institution (the Erasmus Program) and from various European countries, Asia, North America and Australia (non-Erasmus masterclasses).

We think the strategy to enhance international cooperation is sustained by the implementation, at an international level, of a specific web page in English (under construction at present) in the conservatory website, connected to study and teaching possibilities in the Conservatory, and trying to contact other institution interested to develop joint degrees under the Erasmus. The geographic location of Friuli Venezia Giulia region is a natural bridge to Eastern Europe. Austria, Slovenia and the entire area Alpe-Adria, are the first partners for cross-border projects. We recently discussed this possibility with our partners so as to establish a joint degree, following the Bologna Process' indications. The administrative structure of Erasmus office plans to have informal contacts with our Erasmus Coordinator and later on, to discuss the topic with the International Relations Coordinator and the Dean.
